

Challenges & Solutions	 Differences in class schedules between Japan and Korea made it difficult to arrange communication opportunities for students Since our school offers multiple foreign language options besides Japanese, students felt considerable pressure regarding Japanese language learning Concerns over online crimes, including deepfake-related incidents, increased apprehension about participating in online exchanges
	Response Measures: In addition to live Zoom sessions, platforms such as Padlet and Notion were used for asynchronous opinion exchanges
	☐ To ease pressure, communication was also conducted in English, with Japanese-speaking students assisting by offering explanations when necessary
	☐ Schedules were carefully coordinated, utilizing evening self-study hours for lectures and exchange activities
	Comprehensive training on SNS etiquette and online safety was provided in advance to prevent potential incidents. Students were instructed not to use personal accounts for private communication and to avoid unnecessary exposure of their faces or personal information during exchanges
