Challenges & Solutions	 The project started later than planned, leading to difficulties such as appointing coordinators and adjusting the academic calendar. Differences in academic schedules and time zones between Korea and France created challenges in coordinating exchange sessions. Teachers maintained regular communication starting one month prior to the exchange to identify feasible times. With students' understanding, after-school hours were utilized for the exchange.
Future Plans (*Follow-up Schedule, Additional Exchange Measures)	 An agreement has been reached with the UNESCO school in France to maintain ongoing exchanges. Plans include conducting academic exchanges and collaborative projects on SDG-related themes through online platforms.
