Challenges & Solutions

- Most students had little prior experience with international exchange and initially showed limited interest. After emphasizing the value and enjoyment of such programs, participants were successfully recruited. Those who joined responded positively, giving the activity meaningful significance, though increasing overall engagement remains an area for improvement.
- Due to personal circumstances, some students were unable to participate after school or on Saturdays, making it difficult to secure sufficient time for the activities. With the cooperation of other subject teachers, some class hours were allocated, but the limited duration left little room for preparation, creating significant challenges. Coordinating schedules and activity durations with the partner school also proved difficult, and as a result, the program was conducted under somewhat constrained conditions.
- Students who interacted with their Japanese peers online expressed a strong desire for face-to-face exchanges; however, the financial burden remains a significant obstacle.
