etc.)	Through conversations in Japanese and English, students improved their language skills and strengthened their ability to use languages in real-life communication. Beyond language itself, they learned to understand different communication styles and cultivate the ability to engage in effective dialogue.
	3. Fostering Global Citizenship
	The exchange encouraged students to reflect on their global roles and responsibilities while discussing solutions to shared challenges.
Challenges & Solutions	Although scheduling adjustments posed challenges, both schools cooperated to make the exchange possible. Due to limited budgets, in-person visits were not feasible, so the program was conducted entirely online through joint classes and exchanges. Students with strong interest in Japanese culture and language were selected, and activities were carried out in English and Japanese. Thanks to their digital fluency, students engaged smoothly, though many expressed regret about the lack of in-person exchanges.
Future Plans (*Follow-up Schedule, Additional Exchange Measures)	We plan to continue building trust and sustaining exchanges with Kyoto Prefectural Sagano High School, with the goal of organizing an international exchange visit to Japan in the 2025 academic year. This will include visits to two Japanese high schools that previously visited our school this year. In addition, in December 2024, students from our school will meet in person with students from Yishun Innova Junior College (YIJC) in Singapore, carrying out international exchange activities at locations such as Orchard Road.
