	 Prior to face-to-face exchange, students shared self-introductions in Japanese, English, and Korean via Padlet, and also exchanged and watched videos introducing each other's schools.

Challenges & Solutions	Online exchanges through platforms such as email and social media offered students valuable opportunities to share their thoughts freely, without time constraints. However, organizing joint classes via Zoom presented certain challenges. Although the participating countries, including the United States, are in similar time zones, differences in academic calendars made scheduling difficult. Consequently, the sessions were held after regular school hours, typically starting around 4 p.m. Despite these challenges, the enthusiasm and dedication of the students turned these classes into engaging and meaningful learning experiences.
Future Plans	We will continue to promote cultural exchange and work collaboratively to sustain reciprocal school visits over time.
