What is the Global Teacher Campus?

The Global Teacher Campus is one of the flagship missions of the Global Education Coalition.

The initiative aims to reach **1 million teachers most affected** by COVID-19 school disruptions with opportunities to engage in professional development **free of charge**.

How does it work?

A number of Global Education Coalition partners are offering their teacher training programmes, courses, and educational resources at no cost to support teachers to develop **digital skills and pedagogical competencies for online, remote, and hybrid teaching.**

Course offerings are made available via the Global Teacher Campus through an online catalogue of self-paced and facilitated courses curated by UNESCO.

Courses range from introduction to basic digital skills to advanced applications of digital technologies for lesson planning, formative assessment, classroom management, and online group activities.

Who can access the courses?

All course offering are available free of charge to **teachers**, **teacher** educators, and teacher training institutions.

Teachers and teacher educators can access the self-paced courses by clicking the link provided on our website.

Teacher training institutions are invited to contact us directly to make arrangements for delivering facilitated courses through their programmes.

Why focus on teachers?

COVID-19 has underscored that teachers are the backbone of every education system. School disruptions challenged teachers and schools to deliver quality instruction in online and remote learning environments. The Global Teacher Campus aims to provide teachers with learning opportunities that can contribute to building more adaptive and resilient education systems.

What is the Global Education Coalition?

The Global Education Coalition was established by UNESCO in March 2020 to meet the urgent and unprecedented need for continuity of learning as the COVID-19 pandemic disrupted education systems across the world. Under UNESCO's leadership, the Global Education Coalition has brought together key education actors with the common goal of forging cross-sector and multi-stakeholder cooperation with the guiding principle of leaving no one behind. The Coalition currently has 147 partners and is operating in 112 countries.

The digital teacher

An introductory course developed by UNESCO for online teaching with an emphasis on digital pedagogy. Teachers will learn to use digital technologies to create relevant, authentic, and engaging learning experiences. The course will enhance knowledge of digital tools and how to use them meaningfully in teaching. Designed for both novice and expert users of technology to extend and supplement their practice.

Online and distance learning for teachers in Africa

ODLTA in an introductory course for teachers and teacher educators to deliver online and remote education programmes. It was developed by UNESCO in response to school closures due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The course has a focus on African countries but is relevant to teachers working in development contexts worldwide.

Learning to teach online

Teachers will learn how to enhance course designs through better use of digital technologies for fully online or blended-learning classes. The course will cover effective online teaching practices and their relationship to the use of different technologies. This is a hands-on, practical course that will guide teachers through the creation or improvement of their online courses.

Be an online tutor in 24 Hours

With this introductory course, teachers will learn about all the tools needed to conduct an online class. The course will enhance teachers' understanding of up-to-date practices, how to conduct basic remote-learning courses, and how to teach effectively through a digital educational platform.

Design an online course in 24 Hours

As a follow-up course to 'Be an Online Tutor in 24 Hours,' this course will enable teachers to fine-tune the skills acquired by developing their own online classroom. Teachers will learn how to plan and design online lessons and how to integrate publicly-available open educational resources.



A wide selection of training courses

From a digital learning platform, teachers can access more than 160 courses and 2,800 hours of training in different languages at no cost. Teachers will be provided with educational resources and tools to prepare their lessons from home, recommending activities to their students, and supporting them in carrying them out.
