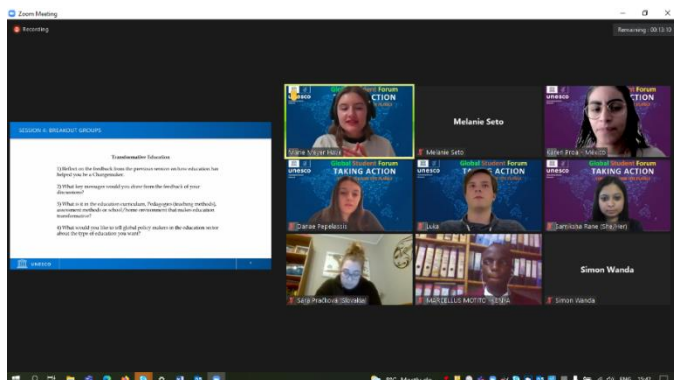
Special Video Message by Stefania Giannini for the opening of the ASPnet Global Student Forum

First Global Student Forum brings together ASPnet students and youth from around the world

Between December 7th and 9th 2021, ASPnet's Global Student Forum took place digitally, the



first forum to bring together ASPnet students and youth leaders to discuss pressing global issues and to have their key messages heard by policymakers. A total number of 130 ASPnet students and 20 Youth Leaders from more than 55 countries participated actively by discussing relevant topics such as climate change, human rights, or education for sustainable development.

The meeting was co-designed by youth leaders and ASPnet students, including themes, contents and formats, , thus centering on young perspectives. Additionally, through a variety of stakeholders, such as YoU-CAN, ICUA and the Korean National Commission for UNESCO being involved, as well as the funding through the Hainan Provincial People's Government, the Forum has distinguished itself through an interdisciplinary and concrete approach to global contemporary issues.

ASPnet school receives UNESCO-Japan Prize on Education for Sustainable Development 2021 #ESDPrize

An ASPnet school was one of the winners of the prestigious prize. It is an ASPnet school implementing Waldorf pedagogy based in Peru: The Kusi Kawsay School. It promotes the protection and preservation of indigenous people's rights, culture, values and knowledge.

During his remarks, the president of the Kusi Kawsay Association, Mr Román Vizcarra Noriega, voiced the damage that colonialism has caused for communities and on an individual level and adds:

"It's time for the silenced voices of all of the native peoples of the earth to be heard because this voice holds thousands of years of experience. Experience in building societies that live in harmony with everything that exists."
