Join the GREEN SCHOOLS movement!

CALL FOR PARTICIPATION

- **About the movement:** Green schools play a critical role in promoting social change, global citizenship, and community action by integrating ESD and climate action into every aspect of the school (whole-school approach) to build a sustainable culture. UNESCO and the Greening Education Partnership (GEP) have released a new guide providing **a quality standard for greening schools** outlining four core areas for integrating sustainability principles and climate action (school governance, facilities and operation, teaching and learning, and community engagement). ASPnet schools are invited to join the movement and become Green Schools!
- **What to do:** Examine if your school aligns with the **quality standard for greening schools** developed by UNESCO and GEP and let us know to what extent your school meets the criteria by completing a dedicated on-line form (link found on the [concept note](#)). When your request is accepted, your school's name will be listed on UNESCO's webpage dedicated to monitoring global country progress on greening education. You will also receive a GEP 'badge' to use in your communications (web page, etc.).
- **Deadline for submitting forms: 15 November 2024**

Consultation on the Evolving right to education with ASPnet schools

DEADLINE EXTENTION

- **Description of the Activity:** Committed to ensuring that young people – as rights holders – participate in shaping the policies that concern them, UNESCO is conducting a consultation on the evolving right to education with school children. ASPnet schools interested in participating will be invited to dedicate two 45-minute classes to “***the future of the right to education.***” During each session, students will be encouraged to discuss and exchange on how they see the right to education today, and what needs to be done to protect it in our current world. ***Participating schools will receive from UNESCO a lesson/activity plan to help organize the dialogue.*** A summary of the discussions should then be sent to UNESCO in the form of either an essay (1 page), a video (2min max), or a PowerPoint presentation. Several submissions can be sent per school and class.
- **Target audience:** students aged 10-14 and 15-18.
- **Timeline:** Deadline for expressing your interest: **18th October 2024**; Submissions should be shared with UNESCO by **December 1st, 2024**.
