CALL FOR PARTICIPATION

- Nominations are now open for the very first edition of the <u>UNESCO Prize on Global Citizenship</u>
 <u>Education</u>. This new prize, generously funded by the Republic of Korea, celebrates outstanding
 work in Global Citizenship Education (GCED). It aims to recognize impactful projects, programs,
 or initiatives that are helping build a more just, peaceful, and sustainable world through
 education.
- Two winners will be selected by an international jury in 2025; each will receive a USD 50,000 award.
- <u>Interested</u> applicants should <u>request a user account</u> to gain access to the online application form. Once their account is approved, applicants should fill in and submit the <u>online application form</u> in English or in French. (Here's a preview of the application form.)
- Deadline: 1 September 2025 (midnight, Paris time) is the final deadline for official nominations to

UNESCO HQ via UNESCO's online platform. Candidates should submit their applications early to allow National Commissions or NGOs enough time to review and select nominees. Please check with your nominating entity for their suggested submission date.
