- We are pleased to share the [Santo Domingo Roadmap: Towards Lasting Peace](#), developed following the [High-Level regional meeting held in Santo Domingo](#) from November 12 to 14, which aimed to advance the implementation of **the 2023 Recommendation on Education for Peace, Human Rights, and Sustainable Development in Latin America and the Caribbean in 2026**.
- The roadmap sets out **short- and medium-term regional and national actions** and highlights key proposals discussed to strengthen education policies and practices in support of

more just and peaceful societies. We invite you to review, disseminate, and ideally incorporate it into your 2026 action plans.

- You may also wish to explore the [Resource Kit](#), which brings together practical guides and methodologies for different educational levels, including implementation guide, a handbook on preventing hate speech, and innovative materials and resources such as the board game “African diaspora”, and resources on socio-emotional learning and integrating the General History of Africa into education systems.
